This program provides an opportunity for customers to help each other by making voluntary contributions to assist low-income residential customers struggling to pay their electric bill.

We offer two convenient ways for you to donate:

Anyone wishing to contribute to the Residential Energy Assistance Program may donate in person, by phone, by mail and on the monthly billing statement. Customers may also elect to have REAP automatically deducted from a debit or credit card. Guidelines

Wahkiakum PUD will accept voluntary contributions identified specifically for the Residential Energy Assistance Program. All contributions should be made payable to and collected by the district to assist qualified low-income residential customers paying their electric bills.

Eligibility for Assistance

- ◆ Applicants must be active residential account holders of the District
- ◆ Applicants may not receive assistance for vacated or second homes
- ◆ Customers are not required to be in disconnect status in order to be eligible
- ◆ Funds are only available for residential electric energy assistance (basic charge plus electric usage)
- ◆ Customers may receive assistance once per calendar year for one residential account; funds may only be applied to one monthly billing cycle
- ◆ Customers qualify based on household income guidelines

Who Gets Help

All of the funds raised by the Residential Energy Assistance Program stay in Wahkiakum County to help local low income families in need. Wahkiakum County Health and Human Services screens applicants to ensure they meet eligibility.
